The Pastor's Pen

"For those who shaped the Apostles Creed, belief in God is meant to fundamentally change our perspective on the world, on our place in it, and on our own lives." This quote from Adam Hamilton's book, <u>Creed</u>, gives us a glimpse of what we can learn by exploring our faith, and the history of faith down through the ages.



One of the earliest creeds is from Romans 10:9, "Jesus is Lord." By the second century another creed was popular and written on the walls of catacombs, "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior". Here the first letter of each word spells out the Greek word for "fish." Even the illiterate could draw a simple fish, and proclaim their faith. By the end of the second century (or the beginning of the third), the Old Roman Symbol was used. This creed is very similar to the Apostles Creed which was formulated during the fourth century, and is the one we say today.

I guess the real question is what do you believe? Your faith really does inform your day-to-day decisions. Your faith helps to make sense of the really big questions of life.



A New 10-Week Bereavement Class and Support Group Is Starting...



Board of Trustees Special Meeting

August 5, 2024 at 5:30 pm

Board Members Present: Kay, Dick, Shawn, Dennis, Lyn, and Carol

The special meeting was called to order by Kay for the purpose of replacing the current Church Property Hazard Insurance Policy.

The current coverage with Guide One will end August 6, 2024. The company has notified us that they will not be renewing our policy.

Kay has been searching for replacement insurance options. Several companies will not provide full coverage including liability coverage. Some companies will not consider covering us because of the day care, even though they have their own insurance coverage. The number of companies who offer insurance coverage for churches has decreased over the last several years.

The only option that had an affordable premium, reasonable deductibles, and full coverage with no need for excess coverage, was through the UCC Church Board. Susan Bacon is the agent providing the quote. They valued the property at \$3 million. The deductible for wind and hail coverage is based on 1% of the property value or \$30,000. The deductible for other claims is \$5,000. The premium quoted is \$8600-\$8700 per year, payable in two semi-annual (6 months) payments.

Our current policy through Guide One had an annual premium of \$7600.00 and a \$10,000.00 deductible.

Motion by Dick to accept the quote from the UCC Church Board and to continue to look for other options. 2nd by Lyn. Discussion about where the funds would come from for the deductible in case of a large claim was entertained. The church has savings in CDs that could be accessed in that event. Motion passed.

In other business, Kay has talked with John Carbajal about the status of the boulevard trees. The second tree from the end is dead and should be removed. The dead branches in the other trees will be trimmed out. John has made an agreement with the City of Belle Fourche to cost-share the project at 50%.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:35pm.
