Review of Minutes: Harlene H. made motion to approve minutes of previous meeting, 2nd by Melanie A., Motion carried.

Meeting Attendance: Colleen A., Melanie A., Aurora V., Margaret S., Phyllis S., Harlene H., Mischelle R., Pastor Chuck and Marilyn H. Blake H was absent.

REPORTS:

Pastoral Report: Visits for October 11 members/ 15 hospice. Attended Trustees, Diaconate, BH Association meeting. Finished up Bible Study. Also help with Compassion Cupboard and Spooktacular. Continues with the Grief/Bereavement classes. New Bible study starting on the 20th of November "Light of the Advent" 4 week class.

Church Attendance for October: 156 adults, 15 children.

Shut in Report: Harlene's list is getting shorter. Everyone she contacts continue to appreciate her calls/visit.

OLD/UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Communion Dec1st: Melanie/Aurora will set up. Mischelle, Margaret will help serve. Mischelle will order bread. We will also need some grape juice.

Hunter Supper: November 9^{th} - 5:00 – 6:30. Pastor Chuck will make up some posters and Harlene will take them around.

Sanctuary decorating: After church on the 24th of November.

Christmas baskets: Sign-up sheet passed around. Will assemble baskets on the 22nd and go caroling/hand out baskets after church with a hayride if not to cold. Everyone is invited to go caroling, the more the merrier.

NEW BUSINESS:

Christmas letter for pastor: Colleen has written this up and will check with Margy Kokesh to see if she will take care of the money.

By law meeting: Church council and anyone interested are asked to attend the meeting on the 14th of November starting at 5:30 pm.

Active member list: We need to take off the following members from this list: Joe Thomas, Dottie Clarkson, Teague, Irene Olson, Glenn Stephens, Ed Denham, Rita Holdhusen.

Good of the church: Letter from Yankton hospital read regarding needs for hygiene products for residents. Will leave a drop box at the back of the church and mail it out by the 6th of December. Motion made by Marilyn H., seconded by Phyllis S., motion carried.

Board of Trustees Minutes of the November 12, 2024 Meeting 5:30pm

Present: Kay, Lyn, Sandra, Dennis, Shawn, Dick, Carol, and Pastor Chuck

Call to Order, Kay Opening Prayer, Pastor Chuck

Reading of the October 8, 2024 meeting. Minutes were approved as read.

Kay presented the Financial Reports: Revenue is up and Expenses are under the budgeted amounts for January through October of 2024. M-Dick 2nd-Lyn to approved the financial reports as presented subject to audit. Motion passed.

Kay reported updates on several old business items: A) Tony Albright has replaced the facia on the north peak of the gable end and presented an invoice for material and lift rental of \$2313.47. The hail damage settlement account has a balance of \$9000 ample to cover the invoice. Some discussion as to whether the facia has been painted and if not, whose responsibility is it. B) Resurfacing the front steps is on hold. James Urbanic has the correct materials and needs 3 8-hour days of 50-degree weather to apply the epoxy surface. It will probably be spring before the resurfacing can be completed. C) The two CDs in the amount of \$50,000 and \$60,000 were renewed as one \$110,000 CD for 6 months at a rate of 4.4%. The \$2883 interest earned was deposited into the Capital Improvement account. D)Fire Pro has serviced all of the church fire extinguishers and recharged one of them.

Kay reviewed the Special Fund Accounts, all of the special account balances are in a good place. Some potential projects for the undesignated Memorial funds were discussed. Purchasing new pew cushions has been entertained previously. An estimated cost of \$5100 was received last year from Waggoners, Inc., Hutchinson, Kansas. The cushions are reversible, have a 20-year warranty, are available in several fabrics and colors. M-Dick 2nd-Dennis to pursue the replacement of the pew cushions and get a refreshed estimate, fabric swatches, and color chart from Waggoners, Inc. Motion passed.

Kay presented the design from Austin Bishop and his students for the church sign. Discussion regarding the color of the sign and the contrasting background, the artwork, and additions of worship time, and the web address were entertained. Kay will return to Austin with suggestions.

Recommendations regarding the proposed Church Constitution and By-Laws changes for the Board of Trustees were discussed. By consensus, the board should be made up of 5 members. Consideration regarding the number of terms and the term lengths should be discussed by the Church Council.

Dennis will check into a loose outlet duplex reported in the kitchen.

Pastor Chuck presented his reimbursement report including purchases of stamps, books, and a subscription to Christian Century. M-Lyn 2nd-Shawn to accept the Pastor's Report and reimburse Pastor Chuck for his personal expenditures. Motion passed.

Kay presented the proposed Church Budget for 2025. Most of the line items will remain the same as the 2024 budget. Changes for 2025 include the Pastor's salary increase, the addition of a line item for a part time office secretary, and the premium increase for the Church property hazard insurance. The overall proposed budget for 2025 reflects a total increase of approximately \$9600 after projected revenue and expenditures. The proposed 2025 Church Budget will be presented at the next Church Council meeting. M-Dick 2nd-Dennis to propose a 5% salary increase which includes annuity and housing allowance for Pastor Chuck; and to add a line item for a part time office secretary salary reflecting 8 hours per week at \$15 per hour plus payroll expenses in the amount of \$6740. Motion passed.

Next meeting is December 10, 2024 at 5:30pm. Meeting adjourned at 7:20pm.

A SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING HAS BEEN CALLED FOR JANUARY 5, 2025

In regard to the current Church Constitution, revised in 2019:

MOTION #1: To change the current number of Trustees necessary to fill the Board of Trustees: AS WRITTEN:

"Section F. BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

There shall be a board of seven regular Trustees, four elected in even-numbered years and three elected in odd-numbered years, at the annual meeting from the membership of the church, for a term of two years. They shall be ineligible for re-election after a service of two terms until the lapse of one year."

CHANGE TO READ:

"Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees shall consist of five (5) members elected from the congregation. Members shall be elected at each annual meeting for a two-year term. Two members elected even-numbered years, three members elected in odd-numbered years. Each member may be re-elected to serve two full terms. They shall be ineligible for re-election after a service of two terms until the lapse of one year."

MOTION #2: To change the current number of Deacons necessary to fill the Board of Deacons: AS WRITTEN:

"Section G. DIACONATE.

The Diaconate shall consist of nine (9) members, five to be elected in even-numbered years and four elected in odd-numbered years, at each annual meeting from the membership of the church for a term of two years. They shall be ineligible for re-election after a service of two terms until the lapse of one year."

CHANGE TO READ:

"Board of Deacons

The Board of Deacons shall consist of six (6) members elected from the congregation. Three members shall be elected at alternating annual meetings to a two-year term. Each member may be re-elected to serve two full terms. They shall be ineligible for re-election after a service of two terms until the lapse of one year."

MOTION #3: To change the current number of members on the Christian Education Board and their terms:

AS WRITTEN:

"Section J. Board of Christian Education

The Board of Christian Education shall consist of four members, two to be elected every year at the annual meeting from the membership of the Church for a term of two years. They shall be ineligible for re-election after a service of two terms until the lapse of one year."


CHANGE TO READ:

"Board of Christian Education

The Board of Christian Education shall consist of three (3) members, to be elected each year at the annual meeting from the membership of the Church, for a term of one year. There will not be a limitation on the number of consecutive terms served."


